






Growth of Apprenticeship

Growth in New Apprentices Since 2012

Key Facts

- 2 million+ new apprentices since FY12
- 22% more active apprentices than the previous 10-year average (593,000 vs. 484,000)
- 396,000+ participants completed an apprenticeship in the last five years
- 14,700+ new apprenticeship programs created in last five years

Rural Apprenticeship Landscape

- The growth of apprenticeship has been slower in rural communities and data on rural apprenticeships can be hard to decipher
- Using USDA Rural Commuter Codes JFF Analyzed apprentice data from the Registered Apprenticeship Partners Information Data Base System. This approach found that
 - Roughly less than 10% of apprenticeship programs operate in rural areas.
 - On average rural apprentices complete their training at higher rates than non-rural participants.
 - On average rural apprentices experience slightly higher exit wages.
- Rural apprenticeships offer
 - Proof points for the value and importance of offering flexible models.
 - Examples of how to build diverse, impactful, and collaborative partnerships.
 - Promising practices to help engage small and micro employers.
 - $\circ~$ Strategies for scaling apprenticeship to new and emerging industries.
 - A model for innovation and resiliency.




